
Central East District -PRESIDENT Mary Beth Jacobson

- *Dollars donated for project
- *In-kind donations for project
- *Description of project (Extended narrative explanation)
- *NOTE: The Creative/Most Outstanding Project should be #1 of the Top Ten.

SUGGESTION FOR WRITING REPORTS:

- *Start early collecting information. Be the early bird.
- *Collect all data pertaining to project before writing up project.
- *Write up your project in a Word or Mac document.
- *Check to make sure you have not exceeded the 1,000-character minimum for each project.
- *When it comes time to fill in information for on-line reporting, copy and paste your narrative.
- *This will help relieve some of the stress of reporting.
- *More information on reporting can be found on the GFWC *Georgia Web Site. This is a great source of information!
- *Make sure you include the group or groups with which you collaborated.

******Remember January 25th at 11:59 P.M. is the deadline for reporting. ******

Membership Events

Every program, every project, everything you do as a club is a membership event. To continue to grow we need to work to retain members as we recruit new members. We are always recruiting for new members, and it might be helpful to also arrange events that are membership events. Here are some ideas.

Book and Author Lunch

Hold a lunch and invite a local author to attend and speak about her/his book. Invite prospective members and the general public to attend. Have information about club membership to hand out.

Welcome Back Pot Luck

If your club does not meet over the summer, in the fall when you have your first meeting, make it a Welcome Back Pot Luck meal meeting and invite prospective members to attend. Plan activities that require members to mingles and talk to each other. Have sign up sheets for current members and encourage prospective members to sign up as well.

Monthly Tea

Club members take turns hosting a tea monthly at their home. Invite current members to bring at least one prospective member. Purchase vintage tea cups at Goodwill or flea markets and tie a tea bag and membership invite to the handle. All prospective members get their tea in one of those cups—that is a take home favor.

Ice Cream Social

Hold an ice cream social and invite prospective members to attend. Promote on social media and have membership information to distribute at the event.

Virtual Membership Bingo

If the pandemic has taught us anything—it is that we can still connect with each other if we are not in the same room. We can connect virtually. Hold a membership Bingo game via Zoom or Teams. It is a fun way to connect and introduce prospective members to your club.

At the Office

Have a membership event at the office and invite the co workers who are interested.

Library

Reach out to your local library and see if you can participate in their Summer Reading Program, hold an event and invite prospective members to attend.

Focus on REALTORS

We historically have cast a wide net in terms of membership. We will continue that—inviting coworkers, friends, family members and fellow church members to join our clubs—and we will also have a focus on REALTORS.

Our plan is to reach out to new ladies who are moving into your community and invite them to join your club. These are ladies who are new the community and we want to welcome them and let them know there is a place where they can volunteer and make friends.

We are distributing Welcome to the Community postcards to each club at our 2022 August Institute. We ask that each club give the postcards to a REALTOR in your community and ask them to give one to homeowners at closing. Making a connection with a REALTOR that will distribute the postcards is the key to success. Decide as a club who is the best REALTOR to ask---is it someone in your club, or someone whom your club has a great relationship with already. Every club should have at least one member who knows a REALTOR well.

The email address that ladies will email for more information is the GFWC Georgia Membership email address. Julie Walters, GFWC Georgia Third Vice President/Membership Chairman, will route inquires to the appropriate clubs.

When you receive that contact information, invite her to attend a club meeting, or the next project your club is working on--make her feel welcome to the community and invite her to join your club.

*You must have a registered Kroger rewards card account to link to our organization.

*If you don't have a Kroger rewards card, they are available at the customer service desk at any Kroger.

REMEMBER, purchases will not count for our organization until after you register your *rewards* card. You must swipe your registered Kroger *rewards* card or use the phone number or other number that is tied to your Kroger *rewards* card when shopping for each purchase to count.

Why Sponsor a Juniorette Club?

Young people have a lot on their schedule these days. Between school work, extracurricular activities and time with family and friends, and some are even employed part-time, why add Juniorette to the list?

Being a Juniorette offers many of the same benefits that other organizations offer. It helps build confidence, self-esteem, and can demonstrate to college admissions officers how a young person is a contributing member of her community.

However, Juniorette offers young ladies one thing that other organizations do not: A clubwoman for life - provided we stay connected and make sure she transfers to a junior or general club when the time is right. A lifetime of continued service and lasting relationships that starts in her youth.

It take only three young ladies to start a club. In late 2021, members of the LaFayette Woman's Club made the decision to sponsor a Juniorette club. Under the direction of Amy Millican, who is the director, the LaFayette Juniorette Club was chartered. The club started with three interested ladies. Since that time, the club has grown to more than 20 members.

The LaFayette Juniorettes have been busy in their community since its inception. One project has been collecting undergarment and distributing to local schools for children in need.


